Our Numbers

Your Global Sponsorship allows us to invest in our Scholars, empowering them to select the undergraduate study abroad program—whether through their university or a study abroad program provider—that meets their educational objectives. FEA funds generous scholarships of:

- **\$10,000** academic year scholarship
- **\$5,000** semester scholarship
- **\$1,250-3,850** for a summer study (depending on number of weeks, minimum 4 weeks)

During the 2015-2016 cycle, 36 scholars were awarded, a 70% increase over 2014-2015. For the application cycle that will close mid-January 2016, FEA plans to award 50 FEA Scholars to study abroad during the 2016-2017 cycle.

About Us

The Fund for Education Abroad (FEA) was founded in 2010 to increase the number and diversity of US students studying abroad through the provision of scholarships. FEA encourages all undergraduate students to apply, and has a preference for underrepresented candidates, including students who are:

- First-generation college student
- Community-college student, enrolled now or having attended in the past
- Minority student, identified as non-Caucasian
- Non-traditional student, which may include veterans, self-identified LGBTQ, mature/returning learners, student-athletes, and/or disabled students
- Students enrolled in a minority-serving institution
- Students destined for non-traditional locations (outside of Western Europe)

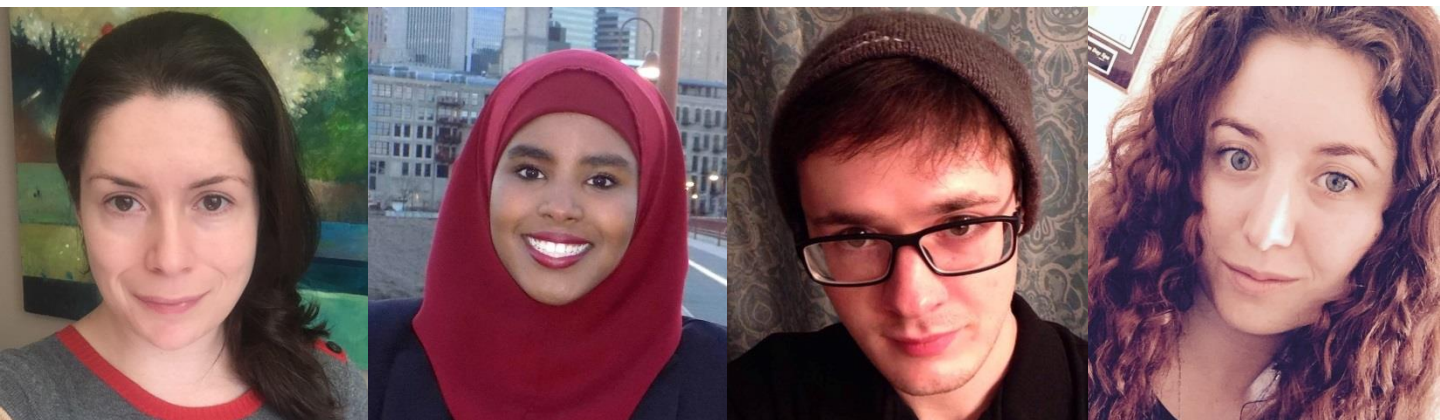

Global Sponsorship Recognition at FEA Partner Events and Campaigns
