# Fund for Education Abroad Awards Over \$250,000 in Scholarships to 71 College Students Undergraduate awardees will study in over 25 countries in Spring 2025

**WASHINGTON, D.C., 5 December 2024** – The <u>Fund for Education Abroad</u> (FEA) awarded more than \$270,000 in scholarships and funding to 71 undergraduates planning to study abroad in Spring 2025. With this new cohort, a total of 1,263 students with financial need, including students of color, first-generation college students, and community college students, have benefited from FEA scholarships since FEA's inception in 2010.

With the amount awarded this cycle, which awards funding for programs taking place between December 2024 and May 2025, FEA celebrates a major milestone of over \$4 million given to motivated scholars throughout FEA's history. The awardees were selected by 92 volunteer reviewers and FEA staff from among 1,639 eligible applicants.

Of the 71 scholars awarded this application cycle, 93% identify as students of color; 28% identify as LGBTQ+; 23% identify as male, 70% as female, and 7% as genderfluid or non-binary. Characteristic of FEA scholars, 94% are first-generation college students, 30% are current or former community college students, and 37% have never left the United States. Currently studying in universities and colleges in 27 states, the new FEA Scholars will attend programs in over 25 countries across five continents.

"We are honored to have the support of so many who are striving to make study abroad more accessible. As we celebrate the opportunity of this new cohort of scholars, we give a special thanks to all of FEA's supporters, donors, partners, and volunteer reviewers who make these scholarships possible," said FEA Program Manager Joelle Leinbach. "As we look ahead to 2025, FEA will continue to put access and equity first as we consider further improvements to our application process and expand our ranks of volunteer reviewers."

FEA awards many different types of scholarships, including Named & Dedicated Scholarships that are funded by specific donors; designated scholarships that are destination- or demographic-specific; and Access Partner Scholarships. FEA <u>Access Partners</u> offer annual co-branded and allocated scholarships, and they participate on the Access Advisory Board.
