

LETTER FROM THE CHAIR

Friends of the Fund for Education Abroad,

As FEA celebrates its tenth year, we are aware of both our remarkable evolution and the many significant changes in the world around us. We face socioeconomic challenges, logistical and substantive shifts in the field of higher education, and a virus that has created a seismic reset in how we interact with others across the globe. The question is: how will we respond?

In 2020, the United States developed a heightened awareness of socioeconomic inequities and began a renewed focus on the disparities in our world. FEA's mission has always focused on changing the face of study abroad by reaching out to students of color, first-generation college students, and community college students. Every person should have equal access to higher education, yet rising costs threaten to accentuate the divide for low-income students. Your support helps us level the playing field for all students and makes study abroad accessible to those who may not yet realize that it is within their reach.

We have also learned that a virus can fundamentally change our daily lives and force us to rethink how we interact on a local, national and international level. FEA responded by offering deferrals to 149 scholarship recipients in 2020 so they could count on our support when travel resumes. We also supported students through online international education opportunities, such as virtual internships and language immersion programs, when they could not travel. 70% of our 2020 scholars still plan to pursue study abroad. FEA was able to navigate the pandemic and focus on our mission by remaining a lean and nimble organization.

FEA enters its second decade as a financially sustainable organization with an endowment that demonstrates our commitment to giving scholarships in perpetuity. Our Access Partnership Program expands our ability to award scholarships and simultaneously connects partners with talented and diverse students who have demonstrated financial need. We feel strongly that impact is not only about reaching the end-user, but raising awareness of a need broadly and creating opportunity for collaboration around shared values, needs and resources.

There is no better example of the impact and leadership of FEA than its effectiveness bringing sector leaders, including competitors, together to deliver the broadest possible impact. FEA's donors, corporate sponsors, and Access Partners are essential in supporting our scholars before, during and after their study abroad journeys. We are immensely grateful for these contributions and partnerships, and excited about the year ahead. 2021 promises a year of progress and transition as we move ahead with Angela Schaffer as our new Executive Director.

Still, our work is far from done. We see a future in higher education with less certain financial stability for our students and therefore less equitable entry points to international education. **FEA calls to action all stakeholders—past, present, and future—who are committed to justice, equity, diversity, and inclusion in study abroad and beyond.** Your support allows us to award more scholarships and to expand our impact to deserving and talented scholars. The students we support are the leaders of tomorrow and this leadership must reflect the diversity of the U.S. and a global mindset that will positively impact the world.

In closing, I want to thank all of you: our funders, sponsors, partners, trustees, donors, alumni, scholars, and steering committee. **Our progress depends entirely on your support which allows us to award more scholarships and to expand our impact to deserving and talented scholars.** From the bottom of my heart, on behalf of the entire organization, thank you.

A DECADE OF IMPACT:

At FEA, we believe that an international education is invaluable, not only to the future of the individual, but also to the future of the collective, as a nation and world. We know that an education abroad experience is often life-changing, motivating students to complete their collegiate program, volunteer abroad, and even pursue international careers. Because this high-impact practice in education is often inaccessible to those with significant financial need, FEA's scholarships change the game for students who would otherwise not attempt to study abroad. FEA focuses on awarding students from demographic groups largely underrepresented in study abroad.

APPLICATION & REVIEW PROCESS

How does FEA select its scholars? We rely on a corps of over one hundred reviewers for each of our two annual application cycles. Our reviewers are trained to evaluate applicants using our scoring matrix, which focuses on each aspect of the application. Individuals advance from applicant to finalist after three reviewers read and score the application, and after a finalist interview. The review process identifies students who are unlikely to study abroad without financial support. The selected applicants become FEA's next cohort of scholars.

Volunteer application reviewers must have an undergraduate degree, two years of professional experience (in any field), and participate in our reviewer webinar training.

2020: NAVIGATING A GLOBAL PANDEMIC

Education abroad was a canary in the coal mine in early 2020, with most FEA Scholars evacuating their host countries to return home before the rest of the U.S. fully understood the implications of the pandemic. The FEA Board convened a Scenario Planning Retreat by May 2020, examining the COVID-19 pandemic from the perspectives of public health, economics, education abroad, and higher education, and determined it was not a matter of whether study abroad would resume, but rather a question of when. The board also determined that the organization was in a strong financial position to weather several years of uncertainty, and still execute its mission by allowing students to plan around the pandemic—with virtual global programs that met all other eligibility criteria and beyond with deferrable scholarships. To that end, the Covid-19 Deferral Policy was

established in May 2020: All students awarded during the COVID-19 pandemic (at this time, Summer 2020 through Academic Year 2021-2022) who continue to meet all FEA eligibility requirements will be granted an extension through Summer 2022. An awardee, regardless of graduation date, shall be eligible to receive their deferred scholarship if their home institution maintains their undergraduate status and they earn academic credit for their study abroad.

PARTNERSHIP TO ASSESS IMPACT

In mid-2020, FEA partnered with the Global Education Lab at The George Washington University to gather quantifiable data on how FEA scholarships have impacted our scholars. It's been ten years since we awarded our first scholarship, and it's time for us to tell a datadriven story of how FEA has changed the lives of our scholars. Our alumni tell us that the opportunity to live and study abroad increased

their adaptability, resilience, and perseverance and broadened their horizons. After their international experiences, scholars frequently reset their goals, obtain additional scholarships or fellowships, pursue graduate studies, and pursue internationally-focused careers. We look forward to sharing the data from the study, and to continuing partnerships with research centers like the Global Education Lab.

INVESTING IN SCHOLARS BEFORE, DURING, AND AFTER

At FEA, a financial award is just the beginning. We invest in our scholars before, during, and after study abroad through pre-departure education, a blogging curriculum to document their time abroad while articulating career skills, and through volunteer engagement and events upon return.

FEA alumni mentor scholars, serve as ambassadors on their home campuses, and develop leadership skills as members of the Alumni Council, or in one of two alumni seats on the FEA Board of Trustees. They also attend the semi-annual Alumni Conference and Scholar Gala.

The FEA Alumni Conference promotes lifelong engagement of alumni with the global community surrounding FEA. We aim to help alumni transition and thrive in the workforce by connecting them with fellow scholars, donors, and supporters, and by providing professional guidance. The conference features résumé and cover letter workshops, a panel of FEA alumni who have successfully transitioned into their professional fields, and many other valuable career-oriented sessions.





Alumni reported that the favorite session in 2019 was the Keynote, given by Orlando Ashford of Holland America Line in which he advised attendees to "take up space" in meetings (while also having something additive to say), and to build a "personal board of directors" to guide their professional lives. Another favorite session was titled Optimizing LinkedIn, led by expert Bianca L. Jackson.

FEA is committed to providing leadership and networking opportunities for alumni, and connecting them with inspiring thought-leaders and speakers from the international sphere to ready them for their chosen careers.

FUNDRAISING & EVENTS

At events across the U.S., FEA's community of supporters raise awareness and funding for dedicated and general scholarships. FEA events increase awareness of the importance of access to study abroad, and allow supporters and stakeholders to connect with each other in fun and meaningful ways. From our first events in 2010 to our virtual events in 2020, FEA is proud to have hosted and co-hosted more than 60 events throughout the U.S. that have raised both awareness of FEA's mission and more than half a million dollars in scholarship funding. FEA prides itself on offering events for everyone, covering the spectrum

from more formal galas and receptions to bowling competitions and fun runs to featured speaker events. Attendees at our events include not only board members, alumni, scholars, higher education and study abroad professionals, FEA staff, and partners, but also their family members, friends, and community leaders.

These events would not have been possible without volunteers, host committees, corporate sponsors, Access Partners, alumni, and donors. We thank you all, and we hope to see you at many more events in the coming decade.

FEA has worked with regional scholarship organizations like the Boston Area Study Abroad Association and TIM (based in Austin, Texas) to organize Bowl-a-Thons and other fundraising events to benefit students in those areas who hope to study abroad.

RUNNING EVENTS

Supporters have raised awareness of FEA by running in Washington, DC's Cherry Blossom Run and Portland, Oregon's PDX Globe Trot, as well as in FEA's own Fun Run and Equal Access Runs.

SIPS FOR SCHOLARSHIPS

One of FEA's first annual events, Sips for Scholarships was held in Boston from 2011-2015 and included a raffle, a silent auction, and door prizes.

CURL-A-THONS

Held annually from 2014-2017, this fun competition took place in Minneapolis and benefited students by funding FEA scholarships and the Minnesota Scholarship Fund.

NAMED CURRENT-USE AND ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIPS

In 2017, FEA began offering named scholarships to fund immersive education abroad experiences for students in summer, semester, or academic year programs (from four weeks to nine months). Named, current-use scholarships were established with gifts beginning at \$2,500. Endowed scholarships were established to be held in perpetuity with gifts beginning at \$65,000. 
ACCESS PARTNERSHIPS




